Highlights of What Is Covered in the 4-day Education

Day 1 – Knowledge and Skills Context

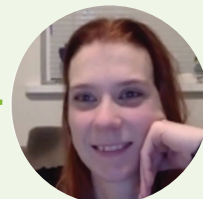
